





The Diocese of Sacramento has been Catholic elementary and high schools blessed with a rich tradition of faith and generosity that dates back 160 years to the first Mass celebrated in Sacramento

by a Dominican missionary priest in 1850. In 1857, The Sisters of Mercy established the first Catholic hospital in Northern California. 



SUBSEQUENT EVENT: Effective January 1, 2010, the Organization merged with The Manogue Perpetual Endowment Foundation, Inc., a California nonprofit religious corporation. The Manogue Perpetual Endowment Foundation, Inc. was established to hold in trust, those perpetual endowment funds of individual parishes and their parochial schools in the Diocese of Sacramento, including the collective management, maintenance, and investment of these perpetual endowment funds. The merger is intended to provide the parishes with a continuation of the strong investment program established under the banner of The Manogue Perpetual Endowment Foundation, Inc., while also providing to these parishes access to the enhanced marketing and development expertise of the Organization. The total assets held in trust by The Foundation and assumed by the Organization as of January 1, 2010, were \$21,615,000.

Each year, an endowment's earnings are used to help finance the specific purpose for which it was created. The Catholic Foundation provides an opportunity for individuals to practice their call to Christian stewardship while supporting their local Church.

Christian stewardship is a recognition that all blessings come from the Lord and these blessings are to be used to serve all of God's children.

Giving through The Catholic Foundation offers several benefits to donors:

Accountability	Our books are audited every year to ensure accuracy and provide open disclosure of all foundation activities.
Socially Responsible Investing	All funds in The Catholic Foundation are invested through <i>Christian</i> <i>Brothers Investment Services</i> in accord with the social responsibility guidelines of the Roman Catholic Church. Our investments, therefore, reflect the Church's values — such as the sacredness of life, the dignity of the individual, collaboration, and the care for the poor.
Designation of Use	Donations may be directed to specific causes that are important to the individual donor such as Catholic education, charitable works, or pastoral activities. Endowments may benefit diocesan-wide ministries as well as parishes, schools and agencies.
Named Fund	When a new fund is established, the donor may choose the fund's name. Some donors may use their own name; others may choose to memorialize a family member or revered friend.
Open-ended	Most funds held by The Catholic Foundation are open-ended. Donations may be made to the fund at any time.
Perpetuity	A gift will be held by The Catholic Foundation for perpetuity. A portion of the interest it earns will be distributed to the designated recipient ministry so that the gift keeps on giving.
Professional Management	All foundation assets are prudently managed by professional investment managers (CBIS) and overseen by the Investment Committee of The Catholic Foundation whose members represent the financial and investing fields of expertise.
TAX ADVANTAGES	Contributing through The Catholic Foundation may entitle donors to estate and income tax deductions.
